1	Apologies for absence	
	Apologies of absence were received from PO. This was accepted by the board.	
	The Chair <b>raised</b> that an individual has shown an interest in becoming a Governor in the area.	
	LP to check to see if Associate Governors are an option with the Trust.	
2	Business Declarations	
	There were <b>no</b> declarations of interest, either direct or indirect, for items of business on the agenda.	
	Approval of minutes from last meeting and matters arising:	
3	The minutes from the previous meeting were <b>agreed</b> as a true and accurate record and signed by the Chair.	
	Summer 1 minutes:	
	Impact of extension work	
	The HT <b>discussed</b> that the building work will be in two phases. From now until summer holidays building work is taking place at the side of the building, and is <b>not</b> impacting school.	
	The building work in September will mean that one year group will need to be educated in the hall. PE and music will have to be outside. Assemblies will be held in classrooms. Builders to provide school with storage. Staff room is due to be <b>completed</b> on 30 <sup>th</sup> August.	





	HT will be onsite with builders, while they break through the building walls.	
	<u>Budget</u>	
	The Chair and Trust have <b>approved</b> budget. Budget is currently set at Amber. See item	
	5.	
4	Appoint chair and vice-chair of governing body & decide term of office & to appoint	
	designated governors	
	NJ <b>shared</b> that happy to carry on with role as Chair, but may need to review this	
	depending on work commitments. Chair <b>raised</b> that if anyone is interested in the role in the future to let the Chair/HT know and they can set plans in place. HTo nominated	
	NJ and HT seconded. HT nominated LR to continue as Vice Chair and HTo seconded.	
5	HT report	
	The HT <b>shared</b> report with Governors in the meeting.	
	The school currently has 170 children. SEND funding comes from the family of schools and the local authority.	
	Charte day was hold today, and I D has returned to toach Dance to children	
	Sports day was held today, and LR has returned to teach Dance to children.	
	The Chair <b>asked</b> about school events for Governors that are not parents of children at the school, and how they can find out about these. JW <b>raised</b> that details are on the	НТ
	school's website. HTo raised that it might be worth Governors having access to the	
	app as this has the most up to date information. HT to see if Jane can provide access.	
	The Chair <b>highlighted</b> priority 2 in the school improvement plan has moved from	
	Green to Amber. HT <b>shared</b> that school ran out of time, and there will be more focus on this next year.	
	Attandance is still above national average IVV saked about the attandance process for	
	Attendance is still above national average. JW <b>asked</b> about the attendance process for children that are late. HT <b>shared</b> they are unable to get outside support if a child is	
	persistently late. HT spoke with another school, and they explained that if they have written to parents, and documented all the communications they have sent. They can	
	contact the parents and raise that any further lateness will be marked down as	
	unauthorised. HT clarified that 10 minutes after the register closes is classed as late. If a child is over 30 minutes late this is classed as an unauthorised absence.	
	The Chair <b>raised</b> the gender gap between boys and girls across different year groups.  The school will look to focus on this gap next year.	
	CA <b>asked</b> if reading had improved since Little Wandle. The HT shared that this has	
	really helped children with their reading.	
	The HT <b>shared</b> the data on KS1 standard, and shared the improvements that KS1 have made across all areas.	
6	Health & Safety Annual Audits GM	
	GM shared the report with Governors in the meeting.	

The main concern was with the move over to a new system, as many items are showing as overdue. There are a few outstanding issues with the tree at the front and the cladding on the building. Although provisions are in place to address both of these.

The HT **informed** Governors that Maddie has spoken with NCC, as part of the cleaning contract they will do some compliance and small maintenance checks at no additional cost.

The HT **shared** with Governors that an official H&S audit had been carried out in June, although the report can take a while to come through. Overall, they were **happy** with approach the school was taking and were understanding in that it can take time for new systems to settle in.

# **Accident Reporting GM**

The HT **shared** the figures on accidents for Summer 1. With one serious incident where child fell into nettles. These have been cut back since the incident.

# 7 Monitor expenditure against the Budget Plan

SB **shared** the budget with Governors in the meeting.

SB **highlighted** that reserves were expected to be £40k, but may be higher as not able to spend any money apart from salaries. At the end 24/25 academic year predicting this to be £22k.

SB **raised** about the letting policy, and if there was an option to drive income from letting the building. The HT **shared** that would need to have a site manager, who can lock up at the end of the day.

HT to **ask** Maddie whether Dave could be the key holder for the Infants as well as Juniors.

#### Approve the writing off of Debts

SB **shared** the items for write off with the Governors. There are a number of uniforms that school has been unable to sell.

In the future parents will order direct from supplier, and collect from school. HTo raised that some schools have a pop up shop for the uniforms. This will also save on school admin for invoicing of uniforms.

SB **informed** Governors that debts from two families who have paid for breakfast and after school club are currently being chased by the school. Parents have **explained** that they did not use the clubs on the specific dates the debt is for. School has been unable to find any records to verify this.

HT **raised** that they have put an admin charge for chasing debt. Other Governors raised that they pay in advance for school clubs. GM **raised** that payment terms could be shorter, as parents do know that payment is coming.

9	Monitor standards of teaching (moved from summer 1)	
	LR shared the review in the meeting with Governors.	
	LR <b>shared</b> that current process for monitoring will change next year with slots allocated to individuals, rather than individuals booking their own slots.	
	Feedback from staff has been positive. A new teacher will be coming in that will bring a lot of experience. He will focus on the Voice 21 project, where lessons will be more interactive with more activity based learning.	
10	Review school Self Evaluation (SEF)	
	The HT <b>shared</b> the SEF with Governors in the meeting.	
	Next year this will be in a new format. The HT shared that this report is prepared for Governors and OFSTED.	LCD
	Action for Governors to read report.	LGB
11	Review Equality objectives	
	JW <b>carried</b> out a review, and shared that a new document that will run for the next three years has only just been set up.	
	The school has <b>applied</b> for a grant for new sensory equipment. When new SENCo starts they will ensure that inclusion is embedded into the curriculum, and further work is required to improve staff's understanding of EAL.	
12	SEN Annual Review (CA)	
	CA <b>shared</b> review with Governors in the meeting.	
	CA <b>raised</b> that the number of SEN children on the register has increased nationally. This appears to be particularly difficult for infant schools as often issues are not picked up in nursery.	
	52% of children on register have communications and interaction needs.	
	Needs are becoming more complex, and need personalised targets. Next year the school will focus on making sure all staff are aware of what is available.	

Going forward the school is looking at a class target tracker, that would analyse the needs of the whole class. CA shared about the amount of time children are spending on tablets and mobiles that causes issues with focusing in class. CA **asked** the SENCo what the strength was with SEND. They felt that staffs understanding of SEN is strong and everything starts with the child. Although the SENCo's time can be taken up with paperwork and referrals. CA also **shared** that the school SENCo Catherine asked to pass on **thanks** to Governors and shared that she has loved teaching at the school for the last 17 years and will be very **sad** to leave at the end of the academic year. LR asked if as Governors they were responsible for ensuring the wellbeing of staff. The Chair shared that GM and CA were the wellbeing Governors. LR shared that felt with challenges for next year this needs to be a focus. GM raised that they would like to gather the views of the whole staff, to build a picture of their wellbeing. LR asked if there was support for staff to access help. HT shared that there was a SAS app that can provide support, and they **encourage** staff to use it. The HT **explained** that they try to be as flexible as possible with staff. HT felt that the challenge was that the school had a small number of staff and not all tasks could be shared. HTo **shared** that 'Thank you's' always go down well with staff. 13 **Policies SEND Information Report** Move to next meeting. 14 **Teaching and learning standards Headline data** Included in HT report. HT **praised** staff for their work, as school above national average. Although the disadvantaged gap is increasing, due to complex needs of children, and TAs that previously provided support to some children will be moving away to focus on 121 support. **AOB** 15 Chair and HT to **review** planner in September. NJ/NI HT reminded Governors that they will receive a link from Trust to register their business interests.

	The Chair <b>raised</b> that they visit school each half term to review safeguarding, and will share report at each meeting.	
	They also <b>raised</b> that it would be good for Governors to see the school council in practice, when they come in for visits.
